ALARMING INCIDENT

In recent weeks, outside of the school, a vehicle used to transport some of our learners collided with a parent's vehicle, owing to a failure of the brakes on the learner transport vehicle. Thankfully no one was harmed but it could have resulted in a distressing situation.

This is an urgent appeal to parents who use various drivers, lift schemes, or lift clubs, to transport their daughters or wards to school and back. Please ensure that the driver has a valid PDP (Professional Driver's Permit) which is required by law to transport groups (of two or more) people. Then, please also ensure that the vehicle that the driver uses is roadworthy and has a roadworthiness certificate to prove it.

Please note that the safety of your daughter or ward and others depends on your attention to this matter.

ACCESS TO PARKTOWN HIGH SCHOOL FOR GIRLS

Over the last few weeks, various disconcerting incidents have led us to make some decisions regarding access to the school grounds of our learners, their parents or guardians, and others. These decisions are based as far as possible on ensuring the safety of our learners and other members of our school community, as well as the safety of other children on the property.

It has become the norm for various primary school children, either whose siblings come to the school, or who use the same transport as our learners do, to move freely around the school. Added to this, various high school learners from other schools, who are not involved in extra murals at our school,

have also been moving freely around the property. All of these pose a risk to our learners' property and that of the school, as well as a risk to themselves. We have also had a variety of people coming onto the property who are not connected to the school, and we feel that this creates a safety issue for our learners and staff. In order to limit the above we will be instituting the following from the start of Term 3

- Any learners not from Parktown must be accompanied by an adult at all times (excluding those coming with a school for an extra mural fixture, who are accompanied by a staff member from the guest school).
- No sibling of any of our learners is permitted to come onto the property once they have finished attendance for the day at their school.
- Access to parking on the property will only be granted if the person has a meeting with a
 Parktown staff member. Parents or guardians coming to watch their daughters or wards
 participate in an extra mural activity will need to park outside of the school and sign in at
 the gate.
- Parents or guardians will no longer be able to access the drive in their vehicle to wait for their daughter or ward's extra murals to end at any time of the day. Please may we also ask you to support us in ensuring your daughter or ward's safety by allowing them to stay inside the school property in the waiting area, and not to sit outside on the pavement while they are waiting to be collected.

We are investigating the possibility of getting access to the school for our learners via the use of their Allxs cards, which we hope to implement later this year.

We thank you for your understanding and co-operation in these matters.



On a separate note, please ensure that your daughter or ward wears full winter school uniform only, from the start of Term 3.
