TRACKSUITS

We would like to apologise for any confusion caused around tracksuits and the winter uniform. For a few years, girls have been allowed to wear their tracksuits in Winter, if the maximum temperature for the day was 14°C or below. It was never part of the Winter uniform and, as the girls now have the option to wear pants, this concession is no longer allowed. However, it is essential that the girls wear their tracksuits in Phys Ed as well as for extra murals. We have however said that **ONLY** Grade 12s may still wear their tracksuits during exams and if the temperature is 14°C or below with the permission from the school.




